#### **About CAIR-MA**

The Massachusetts chapter of the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR-MA) is a nonprofit civil rights and advocacy organization dedicated to protecting the rights of American Muslims and promoting justice. CAIR-MA enhances understanding of Islam, combats Islamophobia, and empowers the Muslim community through legal services, civic engagement, and youth leadership development.

#### **Position Overview**

CAIR-MA is seeking a Youth Advocacy Director to lead initiatives that empower young Muslims across Massachusetts. This role focuses on leadership development, bullying prevention, digital advocacy, and storytelling. The ideal candidate is a relationship-builder with a passion for mentoring youth, experience in community organizing or education, and a creative mind for digital engagement.

#### **Kev Responsibilities**

The Youth Advocacy Director will lead three core initiatives:

- Muslim Youth Leadership Program (MYLP): Organize and facilitate CAIR-MA's four-day leadership intensive for high school and college students, currently scheduled for August 7–10, 2025, in Boston.
- **Bullying and Discrimination Report:** Collect, analyze, and publish a biennial report on Muslim students' experiences with bullying and discrimination, next scheduled for publication in 2027.
- Youth Advisory Committee (YAC): Recruit, train, and mentor young Muslim activists through a one-year cohort program focused on civic engagement and social justice.

### Additional responsibilities include:

- Developing interactive and engaging programs that foster youth leadership, civic literacy, and advocacy skills.
- Designing or co-creating youth-driven social media campaigns to amplify youth voices and promote key initiatives (e.g., MYLP, Muslim Youth Advocacy Day, community storytelling).
- Conducting anti-bullying and cultural sensitivity workshops for students, teachers, and school administrators.
- Building strong relationships with schools, mosques, libraries, parents, diversity officers, and youth-serving organizations.
- Coaching youth in public speaking, digital safety, and storytelling for advocacy.
- Supporting legislative campaigns and assisting in fundraising and grant-related efforts tied to youth programming.

#### **Qualifications & Skills**

- Bachelor's degree preferred; equivalent experience will be considered.
- 2–4 years experience in youth programming, community organizing, or education (especially in multicultural or faith-based settings).
- Knowledge of civil rights, bullying prevention, and issues impacting Muslim students.
- Experience creating or leading digital campaigns or storytelling initiatives across platforms like Instagram, TikTok, or YouTube.
- Strong facilitation, mentorship, and communication skills.
- Project management skills with the ability to manage multiple timelines and collaborate across teams.
- Proficiency with Google Suite, Microsoft Office, Canva, and common social media tools.
- Cultural competency and deep respect for the diversity within the Muslim community.
- Self-motivated, reliable, and able to work remotely while staying community-focused.
